The Single Market's GDP in 2021 was more than






The Single Market is home to **24 million** companies

The Single Market allows people and goods to move freely around the EU, creating more choices in products and services at competitive price levels, as well as opportunities to live and work anywhere in the EU.

Sets common values and standards

Single Market rules ensure that products and services bought across the EU are safe and meet requirements on labour and environmental protection.

Helps businesses grow and weather difficult times

Investment opportunities provided by the Single Market allow businesses to protect their supply chains on a much larger scale from potential crises.

Supports finding solutions to new challenges

The Single Market allows Member States to find common solutions to today's challenges while keeping their economies strong. For instance, it provides the tools to tackle the energy crisis through securing access to new technologies, critical raw materials, and clean energy.

Single Market rules guarantee you have the right to repair or replace defective products without costs for 2 years.
